

Having been a truggy driver and due to the lack of competition out there i decided that the new season i would go over to buggy. Having looked at allot of the kits on the market i couldn't decide what to go for.

I then sore the Intech BR-5-Evo at my local track and i was impressed with the build quality and the optional parts already coming out for this kit as its fairly new still.. I also read some great reviews from the States, so i took the plunge.

Building the car i must say went smooth and the quality of the parts is great, manual is easy to follow and there are different gearing ratios to go for as well. I opted for Nathan Powney's setup as he has been running one for a while now and has done lots of setup testing on various tracks. I also installed the longer chassis from the get go and changed my rear springs to the purple ones.

After getting the buggy setup and everything installed it was time to hit the track. I went to my local track to do some testing ready for the weekend up at Stoke. Car felt good and was running great on the high bite astro. I didn't really change setup that much just tyres i found the JC offsets where good and very consistent and i could push harder than i had been doing with other tyre choices.

I have got to say after only doing 4 meeting with it so far i am getting more and more comfortable with the car and setups for it. I am also impressed with the level of service and support from JC racing. I am now seeing more track side support and also a few more people running them getting good results. Plus all the people running them are all very friendly and are willing to chat about setups and some of the option parts coming out etc..
